

## Information for PhD and ResMA students

PhD and ResMA students are invited to all parts of the programme: the keynote lectures, to attend the panels, the roundtable, and to contribute to the discussion. Students can obtain either 1 EC or 2 EC by:

- Attending the three keynotes and at least one panel;
- Reading the theoretical materials listed below;
- Writing a critical reflection (700 words for 1 EC and 1500 words for 2 EC) connecting one of the keynote lectures to at least one of the panel discussions. In addition, at least two of the texts from the reading material need to be referenced concisely and in a to the point manner. The papers should not only summarize / present the argument(s) but also position themselves vis-à-vis the argument(s) they engage with, reflect (critically) on these arguments or connect them to the author's own work and research interests. Topics and angles are free, as long as the paper engages with the themes and problematics of the workshop. If you wish to reference panel papers from the workshop, please contact the speaker in question (or the panel convenor) since these papers are all work in progress.
